Non-Profit Board Training

Matagorda County United Way recently hosted a Board training for members of local non-profit boards and advisory committees. Forty plus Board Members and staff from Matagorda, Wharton, & Colorado Counties non-profits were registered.

Mike Terry, of United Ways of Texas in Austin, was the presenter. Topics covered include: The role of a Board member; Roles of staff; Types of Boards-policy making, advisory, or administrative; Competencies of Effective Boards-Contextual, educational, interpersonal, analytical, political, or strategic; Risk management for boards-legal obligations, insurance considerations, financial controls/oversight; What do new board members need to know, Fiscal matters-Budget development, fiscal controls, auditing & accounting, & reporting requirements; insurance-employee benefits, liability insurance, property insurance, criminal acts, automobile or fleet insurance, and worker's compensation; Board functions-strategic planning; community relationships; resource development; and supervision of the Staff Executive.

Other topics discussed include: Financial decision making & bookkeeping practices, What financial reports a board should see at least quarterly, The need for written Policies and Procedures, Empowering committees to do the real behind the scenes work, Active Board involvement, dependability & preparation, recognition & publicity, How to write a press release, What the media is really needing from each of us, Community calendar coordination, "Out of the Box" fundraising approaches, avoiding duplication of effort, and board personal commitment & conflicts.

Emergency Food and Shelter Program

MCUW as a member of the Local Board of the Federal Emergency Management Associations (FEMA) Emergency Food & Shelter Program (EFSP), helped to allocate the additional \$3,838.00 awarded to Matagorda County by the National FEMA Board. This brought the total allotment to \$42,420.00.

The EFSP is a needs based program for which clients must qualify under federal guidelines.

Final allocation for 2002 include: Economic Actions Committee of the Gulf Coast was awarded \$17,163.00 for utility assistance, Salvation Army-Bay City-\$18,257.00 for rental or shelter assistance, Palacios Ministerial Alliance \$4,000.00 for utility assistance for (361 area code), and Robert Duran Caring & Sharing Food Pantry \$3,000.00 for food assistance.

County-wide Teen Health Fair Coming Up

A catchy name has not been selected as yet (Perhaps Teen Roundup or Teen Blast Off) but a Countywide Teen Health/Informational Fair is being planned through collaboration of Health, Social Services, Business, and other local entities.

A planning meeting is set for May 9th at 10:00 am at Bay City Service Center. Anyone interested in helping coordinate this event is welcome.

The Event is scheduled for Friday, August 9th from 2:00 pm—8:00 pm at the Bay City Civic Center.

Teens will be able to participate in games and activities, listen to music, have refreshments, listen to Speakers or visit booths pertaining to Teen Health issues including: diabetes, eating disorders, chemical dependency, Health risks and screenings, etc. Social issues including: gang awareness, local availability of services, and Community service opportunities to name a few.
